The Danish Jewish Museum tells the story of Jewish life in Denmark from the 1600s to today. The exhibitions 'Flight and Persecution in the 20th Century' and 'Gateway to Denmark - Jewish Life in the 18th Century' offer insight into an important part of Denmark's cultural heritage. Designed by Daniel Libeskind, the museum symbolises the rescue of Danish Jews during WWII. Its architecture reflects hope and the Hebrew word Mitzvah, also part of the museum's logo.
